#### **OVERVIEW OF THE RECORDS**

**Abstract:** Personal correspondence, handwritten notes, speeches, press releases and

clippings, and state employment correspondence and telephone logs that cover both Stassen's routine work as governor and the political (and often) informal process of hiring and firing of state employees that accompanies a change of administration, especially when there is also a change in political

party.

# SCOPE AND CONTENTS OF THE RECORDS

The "Personal" correspondence file (1938-1943) includes personal business correspondence, letters from friends, and the Governor's official 1940 and 1943 Christmas cards. The file entitled "Important" letters (1942-1943) contain photocopies of letters to Governor Stassen from noteworthy people on a variety of topics including responses to invitations and the service of Minnesota soldiers in the Pacific in World War II. Correspondents include President Franklin D. Roosevelt, First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt, King Olav of Norway, General George C. Marshall, General Douglas MacArthur, and L. Welch Pogue.

The power and reach of the political patronage system in state employment is demonstrated by several folders of correspondence (1938-1939), addressed not only to Stassen but to other officials as well, including letters and telegrams from individuals seeking positions, individuals and organizations writing on behalf of job seekers and current employees, and individuals and organizations offering damaging information on current employees. Office telephone logs for the period May through August 1939 supply further insight into the employment process.

Also included in this series are a folder of undated handwritten notes by the Governor, most likely written during meeting and speech preparation; printed copies of Stassen's inaugural speeches (1939, 1941, 1943) and budget message (1939); and press releases, newspaper clippings, and magazine articles (ca. 1942 - May 1943).

"Important" Letters, 1942 - 1943.

Photocopies of letters to Governor Stassen from noteworthy people on a variety of topics including responses to invitations and information regarding the service of Minnesota soldiers in the Pacific during World War II. Correspondents: President Franklin D. Roosevelt, First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt, King Olav of Norway, General George C. Marshall (Chief of Staff, War Department), Robert P. Patterson (Under Secretary of War), the Netherlands Ambassador, General Douglas MacArthur (Commander, Southwest Pacific Area), President and Madame Edward Benes (President of the Czechoslovak government in exile), Claude R. Wickard (Secretary of Agriculture), L.W. K'ung (Private Secretary to Her Excellency Madame Chiang Kai-shek), L. Welch Pogue (Chairman, Civil Aeronautics Board).
