Why Should You Join?

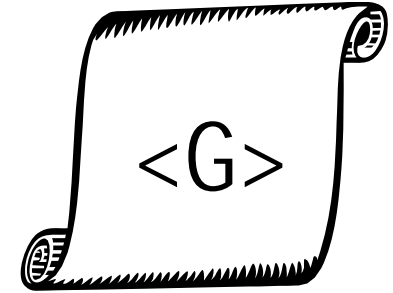
MN GRIN members enjoy many benefits:
