TEAM MN DONATES SONG RIGHTS TO MS. RACHEL

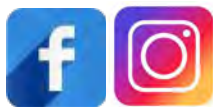

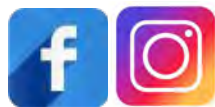
CELEBRITY SINGER SPOTTED ON CAMPUS

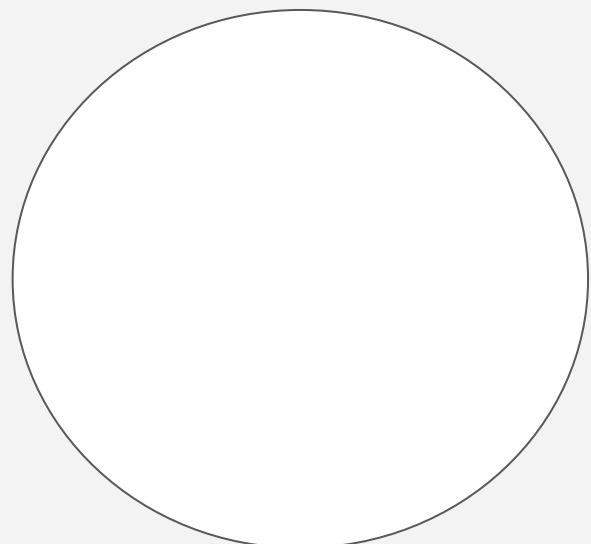
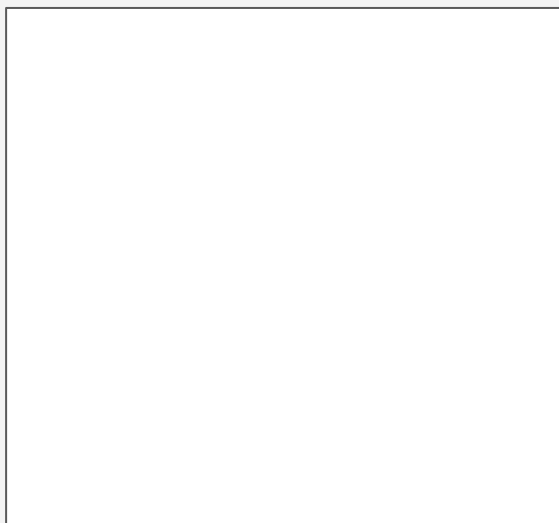

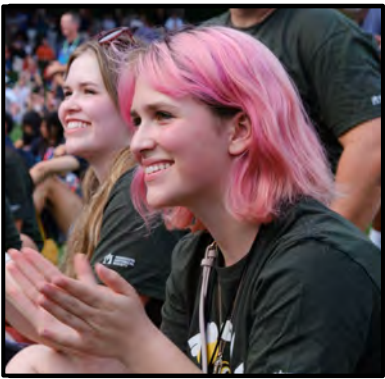
