Throughout building
Look for an eight-pointed star in the ceiling of the Great Hall, and in many other places around the building. The points on each star form the letter "M" for Minnesota, which is known as the North Star State.

TRIP TIPS

- Ask your group leader about your schedule and which exhibits the students should visit.
- Write down the time and place for lunch, lessons, and departure on the back panel.
- Learn the names and faces of the students in your group and make sure they know your name.
- Keep your group in one exhibit at a time.
- Explore the museum and encourage questions. You don't need to know the answers—just help students find their own answers and discuss.
- Count your students before moving to another area.
- If you have questions, ask a staff member!

MUSEUM MANNERS

- Use indoor voices.
- Walk in the museum.
- Respect the museum exhibits.
- Students must stay with chaperone at all times.
- Food and drink must stay in designated areas.
- Use only pencils in the exhibits.
- Respect those in your group and other visitors.
